Science

An Introduction to Plants

In this topic, children will explore the features of plants and trees.

We will look at identifying certain plant species and carry out an investigation to answer the question:

Do seeds need water to grow?



Art and Design

Sculpture and 3D: Paper Play

Children will be introduced to paper-based 3D art forms to construct imaginative sculptures. They will use different types of media to enhance their designs.

The children will be learning about baptism in Christianity by looking at what the different symbols represent during a baptism service. We will also explore how people of world faiths welcome new babies in special ways.
