The Nurturing Programme



What is the Nurturing Programme?

This is a free 10-week course that is available universally to parents and carers, it is aimed for families with younger children as there is a central focus on empathy, empowerment, why children behave the way they do, how to work co-operatively with children and recognise parents' feelings and emotions alongside their child's.

The Nurturing Programme is based on Four Constructs

- Self-Awareness
- Empathy
- Appropriate expectations
- Positive Discipline

The programme will allow parents and carers to explore different approaches to discipline, given strategies and tools to implement changes for a calmer and happier home environment. Parents will understand the importance of nurturing themselves and their children.
