Maths

Money: Children will start by counting different amounts of money, then have a go at making amounts in different ways. They will start to calculate using money, finding the 'total' and giving 'change'. They will have a go at answering tricky two-step problems.

Length and Height: Children will measure length/height in cm/m. They will apply their place value skills by ordering, sequencing and comparing these lengths/heights.

Mass, capacity and temperature: Children will measure mass in g /kgs. They will measure capacity in ml/l. Once again, they will apply their learning into the four operations.

Ongoing: Continue to practice times tables at home (2x, 5x, 10x)

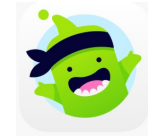

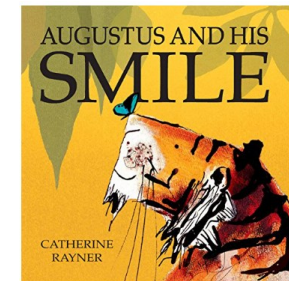


English

Homophone Poems: Children will read two poems based on the homophones 'Two', 'To' and 'Too'. They will explore the meaning of these words and apply them into their own poems, based on a similar structure.

Winnie the Witch: Children will be listening to the story and retelling it in their own words. We will be focusing on 'verbs' and what their job is. We will be looking at how we change tenses using suffixes.

Augustus and his Smile: Children will be looking at 'adjectives' and create a description using these.



Science

Microhabitats

Building upon Year 2's Autumn Topic of 'Habitats', children will explore a range of mini-beasts that live in smaller habitats called 'Microhabitats'. They will go on a minibeast hunt around school and then plan their own experiments. Finally, to end the topic, they will learn about the job of a 'botanist'.

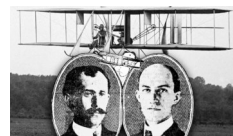


History

How did we learn to fly?

Children will learn about how flying has changed over time. They will learn about significant people to flight, including The Wright Brothers, Bessie Coleman and Amelia Earhart.

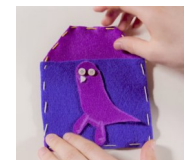
They will then explore a significant event (The Moon Landing) and how this was an important event in History.

Homework and Reading



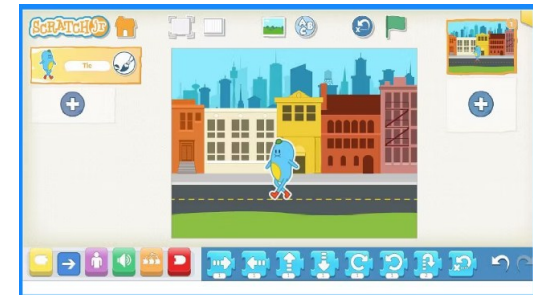
Purple homework books will be sent out on Fridays and must be returned the following Thursday.

Computing

Programming: Scratch Jr

Children will explore 'Scratch Jr' and how to make their own codes. They will learn that coding is special writing that a computer can understand. They will learn how to use these codes to create algorithms. They will plan their own codes and algorithms to create their own animations, jokes and stories.



Phonics and Reading

Some children will continue to practice their Basics 5 sounds in preparation for their Phonics Screen Re-take in June. Others will start to apply their phonics into reading longer texts and start to answer comprehension questions about what they have read.
