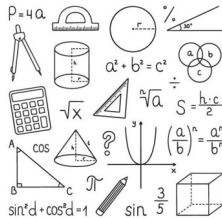
Maths

Algebra – Children learn to use letters to represent unknown numbers, write and solve simple equations, substitute values into expressions, and describe number sequences, including finding the nth term.

Statistics – children learn to present and interpret data using charts and graphs, and use this information to answer questions and draw conclusions.

Position and direction – children learn to describe and plot coordinates in four quadrants, translate and reflect shapes, and use mathematical language to describe position, movement and turns.

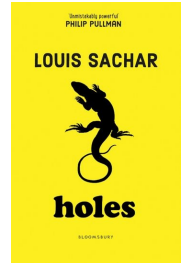
